### Other things discussed regarding finances:

We should hear by 8<sup>th</sup> January if we were successful in obtaining the lottery grant for £16,000 to pay for the trim trail. Due to the volume of money if we were to get the funding we would then need to

be audited. Rachel is going to look into this and what we would need to do. She will also contact other schools who are in the same position and see how they have managed it.

We have already been offered £2,000 from a local company if we don't receive the grant.

£241.91 raised through the ASDA cash pot.

Discussed the idea of approaching other companies and businesses before the end of the tax year to see if we can raise any additional grants, sponsors etc as contributions.

### What's been spent on the children so far

On the Christmas dinner day (Thursday 12<sup>th</sup>) 3 selection boxes per class were won by the children through a raffle, these were purchased by the PTA.

Each class were bought class Christmas presents by the PTA which will be presented later this week.

Dolphins: 4 brushes, 3 sensory sequin boards and wooden blocks for the wood area.

Turtles: 2 easels, racing chicks and other animals and tweezers.

Seahorses: 2 beanbags for their book corner, games and puzzles and bug magnifiers/pots.

Within this we also discussed what else we would like the money spent on, ideas included Chrome books, or I Pads, a laptop for turtles' class and the trim trail/outdoor space. Maria is going to look into prices for a new laptop. (drift laptops to be used for safeguarding)
