# **March Meeting Minutes**

We now can't have princess the unicorn at the summer fair as she's booked out. Considered having for Easter instead but we decided against it as there's not enough money in it for us and don't want to push parents too far for £5 per ride.

Cans - £1

Bacon rolls - £2.50

Crisps/chocolate bars – 50p

Hannah has said anything we need to purchase she can get 20% off at Sainsbury's and 10% at B&M

Everyone to keep an eye out on the prices of bacon and cans of drink at local supermarkets to compare best prices. Current best bacon price for a pack of 10 rashes £1.89 in Tesco, Sainsbury's and Aldi

Agreed cash accepted for the Easter fair as well as QR codes on the refreshment stall and raffle.

Sam has brought up the question about volunteers being DBS checked; we need to check the school's policy.

## 4. Summer Fair

Steve Johnson Estate agents to sponsor the event and will donate a prize of up to £200 in value for the raffle, discussed purchasing a switch or kids Fire table. He'll also make up 15-20 advertising boards and some banners. Hannah has last years' addresses for boards.

Stacey is organising contacts for other raffle prizes, she's been given last years list as a start, will need volunteers to collect.

Discussed adopt a teddy instead of teddy tombola, different prices for different sized bears.

Non-uniform day for donations, suggested dates:

#### Our May event:

Discussed changing it to a film night as this was cancelled recently. However regardless of what the event is there's a lack of volunteers who can help on that datedue to work commitments (or a Wednesday in general due to other activity commitments). #### **Grant funding updates:**

We should find out about the big grant from East Hants council in June/July.

Previous grant money allocated from local councillors has been granted is now in the bank account (£1000)

Cost of the trim trail has now gone up due to the cost of materials rising from £16,000 to £17,800.
