What we already know:

Communicate own responses to each

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Contextualise each concept in religious practise and belief and specific situations. (Understanding the impact)

Evaluate (Making connections)

 Make the link back to the Christian idea that Jesus came to build a bridge back to God. Apply their own beliefs and values to situations in their own and others' lives. (You might like to start with)

 What happens when we fall out with our friends? Should we always forgive people who hurt us? Is it right to forgive and forget? Role, play, different scenarios: What happens when people forgive? What happens when they dou's?

> Inquire into religious and non-religious concepts. (Making sense of the text)

- Recognise that God, Incarnation, Gospe and Salvation are part of the 'Big story' from the Bible.
- Tell stories of Holy week and Easter and make likes to Salvation.

 Give at least three examples of how Christians show their beliefs about Jesus as saviour in church worship.
