What we already know:

Key Vocabulary:

Line: A long narrow mark

Pattern: A repeated decorative design

<u>Texture:</u> The feel, appearance, or consistency of a surface or

substance

3-D: Three dimensional means it has 3 dimensions: width, height and depth.

<u>Grayson Perry:</u> An artist and illustrator famous for art involving his childhood bear Alan Measles.

<u>E Shepard:</u> An illustrator who created Winnie the Pooh <u>Teddy Bear:</u> A teddy bear is a children's toy, made from soft or furry material, which looks like a friendly bear.

What we are going to learn:

- To create texture using different lines, patterns and shapes.
- To create texture with biros, pencils, crayons and felt tip pens.
- To create texture using poster paint and a variety of classroom tools.
- How to create 3-D art using a paper bag.
- About the artists/illustrators Grayson Perry and Ernest Howard Shephard and the bears they drew.

What we are going to learn next time:

- To use a pencil to draw the different parts of a face.
- To use hatching, cross-hatching, pattern, pressure and line to create tone and texture.
- To mix water colours to create different colours.
