# Art Knowledge Organiser: Year 1 Spring 2 – Queen Portraits

### What we already know:

- We can create texture using poster paint and a variety of classroom tools.
- We can create texture using different lines, patterns and shapes.
- We can create texture with biros, pencils, crayons and felt tip pens.

#### **Key Vocabulary:**

<u>Portrait</u>: A picture of someone's face and shoulders. <u>Hatching</u>: A way to create shade using parallel lines <u>Cross-hatching</u>: A way to create shade using crossed lines

**Tone**: The effect of light and shade in a picture.

<u>Pressure:</u> How hard the pencil is pressed on the page to create light and dark shades.

**Line**: A long narrow mark

<u>Water colour</u>: Pressed powder paint that is mixed

with water.

#### What we are going to learn:

- To use a pencil to draw the different parts of a face.
- To use hatching, cross-hatching, pattern, pressure and line to create tone and texture.
- To mix water colours to create different colours.
- To paint the features of the face using water colours.
- To use paintbrushes of different sizes for different purposes.
- About three artists who drew Queens of England:
   Queen Elizabeth I Nicholas Hilliard, Queen
   Victoria Franz Xaver Winterhalter, and Queen
