Key Vocabulary:

Milliner: A person who makes or sells women's hats.

Template: A shaped piece of rigid material used as a pattern for processes such as cutting out, shaping, or drilling.

Line: A long narrow mark

Design: A plan or drawing produced to show the look and function or workings of a building, garment, or other object before it is made.

Photograph: A picture made using a camera.

Decorate: To make something look more attractive by adding extra items or images to it.
